UKRAINE APPEAL UPDATE...

The Ukraine Centre in Cheetham Hill are now accepting donations in kind. They only need specific items which are listed as follows:

MEDICAL ITEMS (In Date)

- First aid kits; Field bandages; Cold/Flu treatment; Antiseptic cream
- Bandages; Sterile dressings; Wound closure strips; Antiseptic body wipes
- Emergency **foil** blankets; Surgical tape; Multivitamins; Cough syrup; Vicks Vapour rub; Barrier cream

TOILETRIES - Wet wipes; Pocket tissues; Pampers; Sanitary towels & Tampons

CLOTHING - **ONLY THE FOLLOWING IS NEEDED:**

- New Thermal vests/pants; Balaclavas; Shoe inserts; Hand and feet warmers
- Opaque tights for warmth for men and women (large size)
- Snoods (care with colour); Fingerless mittens.

There will be a box at the back of the Cathedral this week, so if you can provide any of the above items please bring them during the week or next Sunday. If you live near the Ukraine Centre in Cheetham Hill, please take what you can direct to them, they will be open for donations between 11.00am and 7.00pm.
