World Communications Day

This Sunday, 12th May, is World Communications day and Bishop John (Lead bishop for Communications for the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales) has written a letter to be shared with parishes.

The Second Collection for this day is mandated by the Bishops' Conference and supports the work of the Communications Directorate at the Bishops' Conference. We would be extremely grateful if you could take up this collection.

Bishop John's letter

Dear Father, Artificial Intelligence and the Wisdom of the Heart: Towards a Fully Human Communication This year, we celebrate World Communications Day in our parishes on Sunday, 12 May. Pope Francis, in his message for the day, focuses on Artificial Intelligence – in particular its impact on information technology and communications.

The Holy Father examines the opportunities presented by AI, but also the ethical dimension that impacts greatly on our quest for authentic human communication. This technology can be of enormous value to us, but we must identify clear boundaries as to what serves the common good, and what should be avoided. Once again, I would like to commend the work of the Communications Directorate at the Bishops' Conference. This year, the team has produced and disseminated over 360 items of news, produced 30 podcasts, and filmed several videos, covering a range of subjects from World

Youth Day in Lisbon to the UK visit of Father Gabriel Romanelli, parish priest of the Holy Family Church in Gaza. In addition, a renewed focus has been placed on strengthening and engaging journalists, producers and researchers – particularly in the secular media arena. As a reminder, the directorate's rich bank of professional images – over 285,000 – has been placed at the service of dioceses and other Catholic organisations.

Please visit the team's Flickr Channel to download high resolution images for your work and outreach. Whilst acknowledging that there are many worthy causes to support, the second collection scheduled for the weekend Masses of 11-12 May will offer vital funding for our communications endeavours over the next 12 months.

I would be extremely grateful if you could encourage the parishes of your diocese to take up this collection. 

Act now to stop DIY abortion up to birth

MPs Diana Johnson and Stella Creasy have both tabled amendments to the Government's Criminal Justice Bill that would decriminalise abortion. In different ways, they would essentially legalise DIY abortion up to birth, for any reason. Please contact your MP urgently, asking them to oppose these extreme and barbaric proposals. You can do this using SPUC's easy to use webtool, at https://www.spuc.org.uk/abortionamendments. The Bill will be debated on 15 May, so please contact your MP NOW.

Please pray for the defeat of these amendments, for protection of unborn babies, and help and comfort for mothers in need.

We are seeing positive signs that our campaigning is working, and that the Government want to avoid this fight on abortion. But we must keep writing and praying in this final week - if either of these amendments is voted through, it will be the biggest change to UK abortion law since 1967.

To assist with the spiritual dimension of this struggle to save innocent lives, we have produced a booklet on leading a Holy Hour for Life, which is a great resource for praying for the defeat of this amendment, It can be found here.
