Salford Cathedral History

Though St John's the Evangelist was built in the mid 19th century, the story of the foundation of this Cathedral goes back much further, and it is the story of the local Catholic community.

St John's Cathedral was designed in the Decorated Gothic style of the early 14th century, heavily influenced by the medieval churches of Selby Abbey, Howden Minster, and Newark parish church. Later additions to the building included the Blessed Sacrament Chapel of 1884, the First World War Memorial Chapel of 1923 and the central Sanctuary of 1973.

Salford Cathedral Restoration

During its history, some aspects of the original design and character of the Cathedral have been lost. The repair and restoration project will not only restore the Cathedral's heritage and sense of the sacred but will maximise capacity for the growing parish community.

The use of innovative technologies will provide new sources of energy to heat and light the Cathedral as well as offer long term drainage and roofing solutions to increasingly unpredictable and extreme patterns of weather associated with climate change.

This work involves the temporary closure of the Cathedral until Spring 2025.
